TRANSNATIONAL CONTEST RULES

CONTEXT

“Urbagri4Women”, a European project, aims to foster the integration of migrant women, including asylum seekers and beneficiaries of international protection, into their host society, by enabling them to develop innovative and subsistence projects in agriculture. Co-funded by the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund of the European Commission, it involves 7 Organizations of 7 EU countries (Austria, Cyprus, France, Greece, Italy, Portugal and United Kingdom).

Each country will promote separated contests and have separated winners, but the deliverables will be shared in the common social networks – Websites, Facebook, and Twitter.

THEME

The theme of the contest is “Food that tell stories”, in which a story must be told through a picture of a dish – cooked or not.

Combining different areas like photography, storytelling, cooking and even gardening, pictures of good dishes are expected (good for the body and for the soul) as well as a creative story in the local language or in English.

GOAL

The Transnational Urban Agriculture Contest initiative is carried out in order to foster the cultural expression and the image of migrant women, demonstrating their creativeness by combining different artistic areas like photography, cooking, storytelling and even gardening. It’s also important so as to encourage communication with people from different backgrounds, presenting their own culture as part of a reciprocal relationship with citizens of host societies.

CALENDAR

Contest - From July 1st to September 11th 2018

Winner announcement –September 21st 2018

Award ceremony –September 26th 2018

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE

The contest is open to all migrant women, living in the project host country, regardless of age.

Participants under 18 years old must require the permission of a parent or guardian.

SUBMISSION RULES

By entering the contest, the participant agrees to the terms and conditions stated in these Guidelines. The organizer reserves the right to publish all the images and stories of the contest, duly identified, in its public social networking service accounts, in order to publicize the contest. Such publications do not guarantee an award of any kind.

Each participant owns the copyright of the submitted photos and stories. The participant certifies the work as its own. The participant gives permission to the contest organizers to use, free of charge, the

submitted images and stories for promotional purposes related to the contest, always identified with the author's name.

Each candidate can participate with up to 2 photographs.

Participants that do not conform to these Guidelines will be disqualified.

Applications that do not contain the required information will not be accepted.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- a. Complete the registration form (in paper or Google form);
- b. Attach the photo (JPG, TIFF or RAW) and the following story (word, pdf, ppt). The story should have the maximum of 100 words.
- c. If all the documents are not submitted by Google form, they must be sent by post or personally handed in at the Organization office.

JURY AND EVALUATION

The jury will be composed of a team of 3 members, yet to be designated:

- a. 1 special guest;
- b. 1 national stakeholder of the project;
- c. 1 representative of the Organization.

The evaluation parameters are:

- a. Compliance with all the guidelines mentioned above;
- b. Coherence between the photo and the story;
- c. Originality and creativity.

The organization of the contest may at any time change the composition of the jury if circumstances so require.

The Jury will deliberate until September 21st 2018 and will verify if the pieces of work are in accordance with this Regulation.

The jury's decision, taken by unanimity or majority, will be definitive. Therefore, it cannot be disputed.

PRIZES

The prize for the final winner will be chosen by each national partner but the deliverables will be shared in the common social networks – Websites, Facebook and Twitter.

The organizer will publish the winners' names and the titles of the winning entries. All the winners will be obligatorily informed by email and by phone on the result announcement date.

PERSONAL DATA

Each Organization protects the individuals and their personal data based on the principles and rules established by the applicable EU data protection law.

The Organization pledges to the privacy of the participants, using the data only for purposes related to the competition. In accordance with the rules of the European Union, the Organization undertakes to keep the data for 5 years, after which they will must be erased or destroyed.

Prior to the result announcement, the winners will be asked to present a proof of identification that can be sent by post, e-mail or presented in person.
